SCRIPTURE REFERENCES

GENESIS 2:24-25

For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh. The man and woman were both naked and not ashamed.

MATTHEW 19:3-6

Some Pharisees came to him to test him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?" Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only

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such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

MATTHEW 18:15-17

"If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector."

SCRIPTURE REFERENCES

GALATIANS 3:28

There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

EPHESIANS 5:22-33

Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should

submit in everything to their husbands. Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the



church, because we are members of his body. "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.

GENESIS 2:18

Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him."

1 PETER 3:7

Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered.

MARK 10:42-45

And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

- 6. Would you consider yourself faithful in managing the resources God has given you stewardship over?

FACILITATORS Some of your couples/individuals may believe that sex outside of marriage is okay, and that it is something that 'keeps them together.' Be ready to discuss, with scripture, that sex is intended for marriage, and not outside of marriage.

Stress the importance of dealing with hurts or struggles. This includes: pornography, abuse, past sexual experiences, masturbation, etc...

As leaders, be ready to share how this has been either a strong point or challenge in your marriage. For most of us, at some point or another, it is both of the above. Share as much as you are comfortable sharing.

SCRIPTURE REFERENCES

GENESIS 1:27-28

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

GENESIS 1:31

And God saw everything that he had made, and behold,

it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

1 CORINTHIANS 10:31

So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all to the glory of God.

1 CORINTHIANS 6:12-20

"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be



dominated by anything. "Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become one flesh." But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

EPHESIANS 5:3

But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints.

SONG OF SOLOMON 5:1

I came to my garden, my sister, my bride, I gathered my myrrh with my spice, I ate my honeycomb with my honey, I drank my wine with my milk. Eat, friends, drink, and be drunk with love!

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
