SAY IT & DO IT: Hold up one finger and move it left to right and say NO!

Samuel asked, "Do you have any more sons?" Jesse said, "Yes, David is out with the sheep."

David came running from taking care of the sheep but smiling with love for God. And guess what God picked David.

#### SAY IT: GOD picked David!

Samuel poured special oil on David's head, this showed God chose him even though he wasn't the biggest or strongest.

Do you know why God chose David. The Bible tells us that God said, 'People look at the outside of a person, but I look at the heart.' David took very good care of his sheep, loved God, and sang songs to Him. God loves us too, He sees the love in our hearts for Him, when we share with others and say kind words to others. # Teaching Guide - Preschool & VSN

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#### ACTIVITY 1: SHEEP LOUDD-UP
