THEME: I AM A VICTORY KID!

Live Host:

"Alright Victory Kids — now I need everyone's attention, because this moment is super special!" (Pauses for effect) "Here at Victory Kids, we love when friends come to visit... but we REALLY love when they come back again... and again... and again!" (Smiles big)

"So today, if this is your third time hanging out with us here at Victory Kids, we've got something AWESOME just for you!" "If that's you — go ahead and raise your hand nice and high so our team can spot you. Come to the stage because we want to celebrate you BIG TIME!" We have something really special that we want to give you..." (Team members hand out Bibles) "A brand-new Bible just for YOU! Because we believe God's Word is the best gift ever — it's full of hope, adventure, truth, and it reminds us every day who we are and how much God loves us!"

Can we clap it up and make some noise for our third-time friends getting their Bibles today?!" (Claps hands, and waits for applause, celebrates big). And if you're sitting there thinking, 'Hey, I want a Bible like that!' — no worries! Keep coming, keep learning, and we'll have something for you too!"

CONNECT: CHECK IN / PRE SERVICE GAMES

10 MINS

THIS IS OPTIONAL, IF IT ISN'T NEEDED. PLEASE FEEL FREE NOT TO USE IT)

Pre Service Game Stations: As students are being checked in, use this time to get to know each student. Help them get comfortable in the classroom and find a friend or group to play games with. If you have enough volunteers in the room, get involved with the games. Fun builds trust with kids, so don't be afraid to have fun with them! Make sure everyone helps put away preservice games before large groups start.

GAME STATIONS

20 MINS

Live Host: Let's have our leaders come down to the front to get ready for games!

Are you ready for a game? Shout YES! I can't hear you! Let's get ready to play VICTORY KID FREEZE DANCE! (Note for Live Host: make sure to give commentary during the game, and encourage the audience to cheer throughout the game).

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VICTORY KID FREEZE DANCE

- **Items Needed:** Music
- **Live Host:** I need 6 contestants to join me on stage. Once the music comes on all the contestants need to dance. Once the music stops, every contestant has to freeze. If you are moving when the music stops, you are out. The last contestant standing receives 5 Bible Bucks.

WOULD YOU RATHER?

- **Items Needed:** Would you rather questions
- **Live Host:** It is time to play Would You Rather! This is a game everyone can play! I will read you two options. If you would “rather” the first option, you will stand up. If you would “rather” the second option, you will sit down.

FLOW: WELCOME, FIRST-TIME VISITORS, WORSHIP & OFFERING

25 MINS

Live Host: We want to welcome our first-time visitors in a big way! If this is your first time visiting with us, we are so excited that you are here! So why don't we do this? Let's have everyone stand and clap out as we welcome our guests and get ready for worship.

INTRO: MEMORY VERSE

5 MINS

Live Host: Hey, Victory Kids! Are you ready? We've been learning what it really means to be a Victory Kid. God has called us to live in the world, but not to live like the world. That means we don't follow the crowd—we follow Jesus. Instead of copying what everyone else is doing, we let God change the way we think by renewing our minds with His Word. As Victory Kids, we're called to see others, love others, and treat others the way God would.

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LIVE HOST'S INTRO TO LESSON

5-7 MINS

Live Host: Hey Victory Kids! How's everybody doing today? All month long we have asked one big question: Who are YOU?

We went on an exciting journey to find out what God says about YOU. Not what the world says. Not what people online say. What GOD says.

Each week, we learned some exciting truths, and today we will conclude our theme of I'm a Victory Kid by reviewing all the things we learned!

Key Scripture: Our key scripture for this lesson comes from John 1:12, But some people did accept him. They believed in him. To them, he gave the right to become children of God.

(At this point, you can decide to play the lesson video or act out August Week 4 of Victory Vee Skit)

MINISTRY LESSON

10 MINS

Supplies needed: Supplies: A backpack, a toy shield, A crown, A mirror with a sticker that says Masterpiece.

Live Host Hook: Good morning, everyone! (hold up the picture frame). This is a Victory Kid backpack—but not for school... it's for life!

(Pull out the shield) God gives us His armor to help us stand strong when things get tough.

(Pull out the crown) God calls us chosen—just like David. He picked you to do great things!

(Pull out the mirror) God designed you on purpose. You're identity id found is Christ!

When we follow Jesus, we are protected, chosen, and designed—and that makes us Victory Kids!?

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- **The Armor of God**

In June we talked about the Armor of God. He gives us His armor so we can stand strong and walk in victory every single day! The Bible tells us in Ephesians 6:11, “Put on the full armor of God so that you can fight against the devil’s evil tricks.” That means God has special protection for your heart, your mind, your actions, and your faith—everything you need to live strong as a child of God. Just like the character Micah, in the Armor of God videos you watched, God has equipped you with armor to use every day!

Who remembers the 6 pieces of Armor from Ephesians 6? (Wait for Answers). The Helmet of Salvation, the Breastplate of Righteousness, the Belt of Truth, the Shoes of Peace, the Shield of Faith, and the Sword of the Spirit. The Helmet of Salvation guards our thoughts. The Breastplate of Righteousness helps us make the right choices. The Belt of Truth reminds us to always stand for what is right. The Shoes of Peace help us bring God’s love wherever we go. The Shield of Faith protects us from lies and fear. The Sword of the Spirit is God’s Word, helping us fight back with truth. So why do we put on God’s armor? Because it helps us live as Victory Kids—strong in Jesus, protected by truth, and ready to stand firm no matter what comes our way. When we wear God’s armor, we’re not just safe—we’re prepared to win.

- **I’m Chosen - Just Like David**

In July we learned about David. David’s story reminds us that God doesn’t choose people based on how they look on the outside—He looks at the heart. You don’t have to be the biggest, oldest, smartest, or strongest for God to use you. Just like He chose David, He has chosen you. David wasn’t perfect—he made mistakes—but God still called him “a man after My own heart” (Acts 13:22). That means David kept coming back to God, even after he messed up. He trusted God with his battles and praised Him with his whole heart.

Just like David, you can face giants like fear, loneliness, anxiety, sadness - knowing God is with you and has chosen you for a purpose. You can say, “God picked me, and He will help me.” Being a Victory Kid means remembering that God sees your heart and calls you to trust Him in every moment.

- **My Identity is found in Christ**

From the very beginning, God had a plan for your life—not just how you look, but who you are inside. The Bible says He “knit you together” in your mother’s womb, meaning He carefully designed every part of you with love and purpose. Your personality, your smile, your talents—even the way you think—are no accident. You were made in God’s image to reflect who He is.

That means your identity is based on God’s truth: you are His, you are loved, and you have purpose, and your identity is in Christ. You’re not just another kid in the crowd—you’re chosen, valuable, and created to play a special part in God’s story. That’s what it means to be a Victory Kid—knowing your identity is a gift from God. So, here’s the truth: You are protected, chosen, and designed by God. That’s what makes you a Victory Kid!

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MINISTRY MOMENT

10 MINS

Raise your hand and tell me something you learned today. I am giving away Bible bucks!

When I believe in Jesus, I become part of God's forever family, and I can live with love, joy, and courage because I belong to Him. Today, we learned that **I'M A VICTORY KID.**

- **The Armor of God**
- **I'm Chosen - Just Like David**
- **My Identity is found in Christ**

As a Victory Kid, I am protected by God's armor, chosen for His purpose, and my identity is found in Christ, ready to stand strong, live with courage, and reflect who He made me to be. .

Call to Action

For your call to action this week: Each morning, take 2 minutes to do these 2 things:

- **Put on your Armor!** Say the 6 pieces of God's armor out loud and ask God to help you stand strong today.
- **Walk in Your Identity.** Look in the mirror and say: *Ex. "I am protected. I am chosen by God. I have my identity in Christ. I am a Victory Kid!"*

WRAP-UP & CLOSING PRAYER

5 MINS

(If your campus begins with small groups, please ask review questions before closing prayer. If your campus ends with small group, move directly to closing prayer (these questions will be asked and answered in small group))

ELEMENTARY SMALL GROUP LESSON

THEME: I AM A VICTORY KID!

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SMALL GROUP OPTION ONE - (There are TWO options provided for small group the second one is for the campuses that does small group first)

INTRO

Live Host: Good morning, everyone! I hope you enjoyed today's lesson. Can anyone tell me what you learned today? **(wait for students' responses)**

I'm a Victory Kid!

ICEBREAKER

1. Can you name all the Armor of God? **The Helmet of Salvation, the Breastplate of Righteousness, the Belt of Truth, the Shoes of Peace, the Shield of Faith, and the Sword of the Spirit.**
2. Why did God choose David instead of his older brothers? **Because God looks at the heart, not the outside.**

4. What should we do when we sin or make a bad choice? **Go back to God, ask for forgiveness, and remember that He still loves us.**

Great job answering the questions. Does anybody remember what we were supposed to do last week for our call to action? Wait for responses...

Ask someone in your family—like a parent, grandparent, older sibling, or guardian—to tell you about when they started following Jesus. Then talk about what you believe about God too! **Let us know - Who you talked to and One thing they said that stood out to you**

Remember, whoever shares receives Bible Bucks.

PRAYER REQUESTS

Tell students we're starting prayer, remain with eyes closed, and focus attention on God. Ask for any prayer requests they would like to share. If your small group needs a little encouragement, give them categories like **family, school, or friends** to get them thinking about areas they need prayer in. After students share, lead the group in prayer, covering each prayer request, using the name of each student that asks for prayer.



ELEMENTARY SMALL GROUP LESSON

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RECAP CALL TO ACTION

5 MINS

Today, we learned that I am a Victory Kid!

- For your call to action this week - Each morning, take 2 minutes to do these 2 things:
- Put on your Armor! Say the 6 pieces of God's armor out loud and ask God to help you stand strong today.

ELEMENTARY SMALL GROUP LESSON

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S.O.A.P

S.O.A.P is a simple but helpful way to study the Bible and apply it to our own lives.

S.O.A.P stands for, **SCRIPTURE, OBSERVATION, APPLICATION AND PRAYER** and involves four simple steps.

S: SCRIPTURE

You physically write out the scripture. You'll be amazed what God will reveal to you just by taking the time to slow down and actually write out what you are reading!

O: OBSERVATION

What do you notice about the verses? What do you think the main message is? What verses, words or ideas jump out to you? Who is the audience? Is there a repetition of words?

A: APPLICATION

Ask God how He wants you to apply the verse to your own life. This is when God's Word becomes personal. What is God saying to me today? How can I apply what I just read to my own personal life? What changes do I need to make? Is there an action that I need to take?

P: PRAYER

Pray God's Word back to Him. If He has revealed something to you during this time in His Word, pray about it. Confess if He has revealed some sin that is in your life.
