Can we clap it up and make some noise for our third-time friends getting their Bibles today?!" (Claps hands, and waits for applause, celebrates big). And if you're sitting there thinking, 'Hey, I want a Bible like that!' — no worries! Keep coming, keep learning, and we'll have something for you too!"

CODDECT: CHECK IN / PRE SERVICE GAMES

Pre Service Game Stations: As students are being checked in, use this time to get to know each student. Help them get comfortable in the classroom and find a friend or group to play games with. If you have enough volunteers in the room, get involved with the games. Fun builds trust with kids, so don't be afraid to have fun with them! Make sure everyone helps put away preservice games before large groups start.

GAME STATIONS

Live Host: Let's have our leaders come down to the front to get ready for games!

RED LIGHT, GEECD LIGHT - TRAIN EDITION

- Supplies: Tape to mark starting and finish lines, 1 green GO sign, 1 red STOP sign
- Live Host: I need 5 contestants to join me on stage. Stand on the start line. I am the conductor; when I hold up GREEN, you will move forward toward the finish line, and when I hold up RED, you must freeze—anyone caught moving goes to the railway yard (out) and cheers from the side. We'll cycle GREEN/RED until the first player crosses the finish line without being sent to the yard (or until only one player remains). The winner receives 2 Bible Bucks.

COLLECT THE GOLD TRAIN TOKENS

- Supplies: Gold coins, baskets
- **Live Host:** I need 6 contestants to join me on stage. Before we start, I've hidden gold coins around the stage area. On "Go," search the stage and find as many gold coins as you can—once you have found them, return to the start line and wait. When all the gold coins are found, everyone will come up to count their coins. The person with the most gold coins wins and receives 2 Bible Bucks!

FIOW: WELCOME, FIRST-TIME VISITORS, WORSHIP & OFFCRING 25 MINS

Live Host: We want to welcome our first-time visitors in a big way! If this is your first time visiting with us, we are so excited that you are here! So why don't we do this? Let's have everyone stand and clap as we welcome our guests and get ready for worship.

LIVE HOST'S INTTO TO LESSON

5-7 Mins

Live Host: Hey Victory Kids! How's everybody doing today? Welcome aboard! This month we're starting a brandnew series called All Aboard: Jesus Leads the Way! Just like trains follow the tracks to reach their destination, we are learning how to follow Jesus, because He is the one who knows the way.

Last week, from the story of Noah we learned that God Protects Us In the Storm.

Noah lived in a time when almost everyone else had turned away from God, but Noah chose to listen, trust, and obey. Because he followed God's directions, he and his family were saved from the great flood.

In today's lesson, we are learning that God Keeps His Promises. So, grab your ticket, take your seat, and get ready, because this train is leaving the station!

Key Scripture: Our key scripture for this lesson comes from Genesis 9:13 (ICB): *It will be the sign of the agreement between me and the earth.*

MINISTRY LESSON

Supplies needed: N/A

Live Host Hook: Have you ever made a promise that you did not keep? Now, raise your hand if someone has ever promised you something... maybe to play with you, buy you a treat, or come to your game. Now, keep your hand up if they didn't do it. How did that feel? Pretty disappointing, right? People don't always keep their promises, but God does.

God never breaks His promises. When He gives His word, it's stronger than the strongest glue, tougher than the hardest rock, and unshakable like the biggest mountain. Today we're going to learn about a special promise God made to Noah, and to all of us, that will never be broken.

God's Promises Are Unbreakable

Last week we saw how God protected Noah's family during the storm. Noah obeyed God's instructions, the Ark kept them safe, and the waters eventually went down. Today we will see what happened next. God gathered Noah, his family, and all the animals. Then He made a covenant. Can anyone tell me what a covenant is? (Wait for responses.)

A covenant is an agreement, like a special promise that God makes and always keeps. In Genesis 9:11, God said, "I make this agreement with you: I will never again destroy all living things by floodwaters. A flood will never again destroy the earth. "Have you ever had someone make a promise and not keep it? That can feel really bad. But God always keeps His promises. His covenant was not just for Noah, it was for all creatures and for every person who would ever live, including you!

God's Promises Bring Hope

The storm had ended, and Noah and his family were safe on the Ark. Do you know what Noah saw? He saw a rainbow. The rainbow wasn't just beautiful; it meant the storm had come to an end and their future was secure under God's care. Today when it rains, we see a rainbow that represents different things, some ungodly things and some that are Godly. What we want you to remember is that God created the rainbow is a sign of his promise. God said that when the rainbow shows up, He sees it and remembers His covenant.

For Noah's family, the rainbow meant they didn't need to fear another world-destroying flood. They could plant, build, and raise families with courage. Psalm 29:11 says God gives strength and peace to His people. That's what hope feels like on the inside, strength to keep going and peace to calm our hearts. Hope is not pretending that everything is easy. Hope means trusting God and believing His promises, even when things feel hard or uncertain. It is keeping your eyes on what God has said and relying on Him, even when you still see clouds.

God's Word is Trustworthy

Can anyone tell me what God's Word is (wait on responses)? Noah heard God's words and built his life on them. We can do the same. God's Word (the Bible) is full of promises we can lean on every day. Here are some of His promises:

- God is with me. "I will never leave you." (Hebrews 13:5)
- God forgives me when I confess. (1 John 1:9)
- God gives wisdom when I ask. (James 1:5)
- God gives peace. (Psalm 29:11)

INTRO

Live Host: Good morning, everyone! I hope you enjoyed today's lesson. Can anyone tell me what you learned today? *(wait for students' responses)*

God Keeps His Promises

We've been talking about the story of Noah. Can anyone tell me what book in the Bible we can find Noah's story in? (wait for responses) Noah's story is found in the book of Genesis

Can anyone tell me where Genesis is? (wait for responses)

Great! Let's do it together! Let's open our bibles to the Old Testament.

First person to get there gets a bible buck! (Demonstrate how to find Genesis, and bible verse in the bible)

Now we found it, just a reminder: this week, when you talk about what we learned with your parents, open your Bible to Genesis as you recap what you've learned.

Okay, let's get a little deeper into what we learned today.

ICERREAKER

(this icebreaker has two parts: questions from today's lesson and the call to action from last week)

PRAYER REQUESTS

Tell students we're starting prayer, remain with eyes closed, and focus attention on God. Ask for any prayer requests they would like to share. After students share, lead the group in prayer, covering each prayer request, using the name of each student that asks for prayer.

S.O.A.P

S.O.A.P is a simple but helpful way to study the Bible and apply it to our own lives.

S.O.A.P stands for, **SCRIPTURE, OBSERVATIR, APPLICATIR AND PRAYER** and involves four simple steps.

S: SCRIPTURE

You physically write out the scripture. You'll be amazed what God will reveal to you just by taking the time to slow down and actually write out what you are reading!

0: OBSCRVATIR

What do you notice about the verses? What do you think the main message is? What verses, words or ideas jump out to you? Who is the audience? Is there a repetition of words?

A. APPLICATION

Ask God how He wants you to apply the verse to your own life. This is when God's Word becomes personal. What is God saying to me today? How can I apply what I just read to my own personal life? What changes do I need to make? Is there an action that I need to take?

P: PRayer

Pray God's Word back to Him. If He has revealed something to you during this time in His Word, pray about it. Confess if He has revealed some sin that is in your life.


