Because we believe God's Word is the best gift ever — it's full of hope, adventure, truth, and it reminds us every day who we are and how much God loves us!"

Can we clap it up and make some noise for our third-time friends getting their Bibles today?!" (Claps hands, and waits for applause, celebrates big). And if you're sitting there thinking, 'Hey, I want a Bible like that!' — no worries! Keep coming, keep learning, and we'll have something for you too!"

CODDECT: CHECK IN / PRE SERVICE GAMES

10 Mins

Pre Service Game Stations: As students are being checked in, use this time to get to know each student. Help them get comfortable in the classroom and find a friend or group to play games with. If you have enough volunteers in the room, get involved with the games. Fun builds trust with kids, so don't be afraid to have fun with them! Make sure everyone helps put away preservice games before large groups start.

GAME STATIONS

MEMORY VETSE WIPEOUT

- Supplies: Slides for the screen
- **Live Host:** It's time to test your memory. We can all play this game together. There will be slides for this game. We will say the memory verse together out loud. With each new slide, there will be a word missing. Say the verse again out loud. Keep going until the whole verse is erased.

LEAD THE WAY LIMBO

- Supplies: Music, Limbo stick
- Live Host: On the count of three, I want you to shout YES for the next game! One...Two...Three... YES!!! I need 6 contestants onstage. One at a time we will follow the music and dance under the lead the way limbo stick. Each round the limbo stick will go lower and lower. If you fall while going under you are out. The last contestant will receive 2 Bible Bucks.

FIOW: WELCOME, FIRST-TIME VISITORS, WORSHIP & OFFCRING 25 MINS

Live Host: We want to welcome our first-time visitors in a big way! If this is your first time visiting with us, we are so excited that you are here! So why don't we do this? Let's have everyone stand and clap as we welcome our guests and get ready for worship.

INTRO: MEMORY VERSE

Live Host: Hey, Victory Kids! Are you ready? This month we're starting a brand-new adventure, All Aboard: Let Jesus Lead the Way! Just like a train moves forward on its tracks, we move forward when we let Jesus lead our lives. On this trip we don't drive our own train, we follow our Conductor, Jesus! He knows every turn, every stop, and the very best destination for us.

LIVE HOST'S INTLO TO LESSON

5-7 Mins

Live Host: Hey Victory Kids! How's everybody doing today? Welcome aboard! This month's theme is All Aboard: Jesus Leads the Way! Just like trains follow the tracks to reach their destination, we are learning how to follow Jesus, because He is the one who knows the way.

Last week, in the story of Noah our lesson was about being **Thankful for New Beginnings.**

Noah lived in a time when almost everyone else had turned away from God, but Noah chose to listen, trust, and obey. Because he followed God's directions, he and his family were saved from the great flood.

Today we are taking a moment to review what we have learned about **Letting Jesus lead the Way** through the life of Noah. So, grab your ticket, take your seat, and get ready, because this train is leaving the station!

Key Scripture: Our key scripture for this lesson comes from John 10:27 (ICB): *My sheep listen to my voice. I know them, and they follow me.*

(At this point, you can decide to play the lesson video or act out November Week 5 of Conductor Casey Skit)

LESSON VIDEO OR CONDUCTOR CASCY

2-3 MINS

MINISTRY LESSON

10 Mins

Supplies needed: Conductor Casey custom or Conductor hat or lanyard (optional), small bell, Bible, and three paper "train tickets"

Live Host Hook: Alright Victory Kids, picture a busy train station. There are lots of sounds—people talking, carts rolling, announcements echoing. You're standing on the platform and you hear two voices. One is random noise... the other is the conductor's clear call: 'This way. All aboard!' Which voice do you follow? (pause) Jesus said, 'My sheep listen to my voice... and they follow me' (John 10:27).

Let's try it: when I ring the bell, cup your hand to your ear—listen (ring). When I lift the Bible, take one small step in place—follow (lift). And when I hold up a ticket, whisper, 'Thank You, God'—give thanks (hold up ticket). That's our whole journey today: let Jesus lead the way—listen, follow, give thanks. We've seen that in Noah's story all month long. One of the first things we learned is..."onto dry ground for the first time in over a year. What will they do first?

Let Jesus Lead: We Listen to His Voice

All month we've seen that Noah's story begins with God speaking and a person listening. In a time when almost everyone ignored God, Noah paid attention. God told him exactly what to do: build an ark, bring in the animals, prepare his family and Noah treated God's words like directions, not suggestions. Can you picture being the only kid in your class who chooses what's right when others don't? (wait for a few responses) That was Noah. Listening was Noah's first step, and it's ours too: we quiet our hearts, open God's Word, and say, "I hear You."

Let Jesus Lead: We Follow His Directions

Listening turned into action. Noah did everything God commanded. He built the ark God's way, entered when God said, and stayed until God said, "Come out." The rain pounded for forty days, waters rose over mountains, but the Lord shut them in and kept them safe. Then came the long wait, sending out a raven and a dove, watching and waiting for God's timing. Have you ever had to keep doing the right thing while you waited for things to change? (brief shares) That's what following looks like: we obey the instructions God gives and trust His timing, even when the storm lasts longer than we hoped.

Let Jesus Lead: We Give Thanks for His Care and Promises

After the waters went down, God spoke a promise for every person and every creature: He would never again destroy the earth with a flood, and He set a rainbow as the sign. Then, stepping onto dry ground, Noah's first act was worship he built an altar and thanked God, and God blessed the family with a new beginning. That's our pattern too: remember what God has said, notice His care each day ("seedtime and harvest... day and night," 8:22), and let gratitude lead our words and actions. What's one promise from God's Word you can stand on this week, and one way you can say "Thank You" to Him first? (take a couple of answers) When we listen, follow, and give thanks, we show our world who God is: the One who speaks, leads, keeps His promises, and takes care of His people.

INTRO

Live Host: Good morning, everyone! I hope you enjoyed today's lesson. Can anyone tell me what you learned today? *(wait for students' responses)*

Let Jesus lead the Way

We've been talking about the story of Noah. Can anyone tell me what book in the Bible we can find Noah's story in? (wait for responses) Noah's story is found in the book of Genesis

Can anyone tell me where Genesis is? (wait for responses)

Great! Let's do it together! Let's open our Bibles to the Old Testament.

First person to get there gets a bible buck! (Demonstrate how to find Genesis, and a bible verse in the bible)

Now we found it, just a reminder: this week, when you talk about what we learned with your parents, open your Bible to Genesis as you recap what you've learned.

Okay, let's get a little deeper into what we learned today.

ICERREAKER

(this icebreaker has two parts: questions from today's lesson and the call to action from last week)

- 1. What promise did God make after the flood? That He would never again flood the whole earth.
- 2. What sign did God give to show His promise? A rainbow.
- 3. Why is it important to be thankful to God? **Because it helps us remember His goodness and turns our hearts toward worship.**
- 4. What does it mean to let Jesus lead the way? **Open-ended: It means listening to Him, trusting His plan, obeying His Word, and thanking Him every day.**

Great job answering the questions. Does anybody remember what we were supposed to do last week for our call to action? (Wait for responses)

For our call to action:

PRAYER REQUESTS

Tell students we're starting prayer, remain with eyes closed, and focus attention on God. Ask for any prayer requests they would like to share. After students share, lead the group in prayer, covering each prayer request, using the name of each student that asks for prayer.

S.O.A.P

S.O.A.P is a simple but helpful way to study the Bible and apply it to our own lives.

S.O.A.P stands for, **SCRIPTURE, OBSERVATIR, APPLICATIR AND PRAYER** and involves four simple steps.

S: SCRIPTURE

You physically write out the scripture. You'll be amazed what God will reveal to you just by taking the time to slow down and actually write out what you are reading!

0: OBSCRVatin

What do you notice about the verses? What do you think the main message is? What verses, words or ideas jump out to you? Who is the audience? Is there a repetition of words?

A. APPLICATION

Ask God how He wants you to apply the verse to your own life. This is when God's Word becomes personal. What is God saying to me today? How can I apply what I just read to my own personal life? What changes do I need to make? Is there an action that I need to take?

P: PRayer

Pray God's Word back to Him. If He has revealed something to you during this time in His Word, pray about it. Confess if He has revealed some sin that is in your life.


